Dear Members and Affiliated Associations,

It gives me great pleasure to provide the foreword to this, my 6th Annual Report as Chair and the 111th Annual Report of our Association.

As an Association we have had another successful season worthy of celebration. To commence the year at a Special General Meeting prior to our AGM, it was a pleasure to see David Dilley (#56) and Tim Donahoo (#57) awarded with Life Membership, with both having provided dedicated service to officiating both on and off field across their time with the Association.

Again it has been a season of progress and innovation, all for the benefit of members.

Highlights in 2023-24 included both online and in-person training courses held at venues far and wide across the State, the highly successful and well attended Convention, the appointment of two umpires to every match in the Men's Premier and Shires competitions, and to see New South Wales umpires and scorers officiating at the highest level around the world and domestically.

We were able to kick start the year and celebrate our 110th anniversary with our annual conference and dinner held at Penrith Panthers in August. A great evening was had by all in attendance at the celebration dinner held in the Chairman's lounge at BlueBet Stadium, with memorabilia and photos from our archives on display. Those who came from the country were also able to see Cricket Central on the Sunday for the final day of our conference. A great time was had by all in attendance of both the conference and dinner.

Congratulations to all members and our Management team on achieving our highlights, and I thank you all for your dedication, availability, and adaptability.

The Management team work tirelessly for the benefit of members and our affiliated associations.

My thanks go to Troy Penman for his work as Executive Officer of our Association. Troy has had an outstanding year in his ongoing leadership of our association. Responding to a number of challenges that occur on a regular basis, Troy manages the appointments to NSW Men's Premier Cricket, organising meetings and Association events, and keeping the Association moving and looking forward. He is extremely hardworking, dedicated and loyal, a recognised and respected leader and has been responsible for significant levels of sponsorship and revenue to the Association with benefits us all as members. There are so many examples where Troy goes above and beyond. Along with his responsibilities as Executive Officer and managing his growing family, Troy continues to excel on his on field appointments with the Cricket Australia Supplementary Panel, with further opportunities in the Sheffield Shield, and was involved in the two Cricket Australia national finals, the WBBL (TV) and WNCL (field) in 2023-24. Thanks are extended to Troy for keeping the Association moving forward during this time.

We are privileged to have Bede Sajowitz serve our members as Administrator for our Association. Bede has again had a busy season managing enquiries from members and facilitating the Association's online presence through our social media platforms and our website. Bede ensures that milestone matches, and representative appointments are publicised in a timely fashion.

He continues to be a leader in the challenges presented by OfficialsHQ and his work in this space had been nothing short of outstanding. Our quarterly journal In Black & White continues to be an outstanding publication under his watch. Bede also had another strong season on the Cricket NSW State Umpire Panel with a number of appointments in the WBBL and WNCL in 2023-24.

Claire Polosak, in her role as Umpire Educator-Female Engagement continues to lead the way in so many aspects of female involvement in match officiating. We continue to see an increasing number of women attending courses, joining the Association, and officiating on-field. She is an excellent educator and a great support to the Association staff. A number of our female match officials are also showing positive development in the progress of their officiating. Claire also had an outstanding year on the field of play, both with the International Panel of ICC Development Umpires and the Cricket Australia Supplementary Panel, making her first class debut, officiating in her fourth WBBL final, and with further women's international appointments between Australia and the West Indies in October and travelling to Pakistan in April. Our Association can be so proud of Claire's achievements in both her role for our Association and her list of on-field achievements that continue to grow.

Our Education Officer, Ben Treloar, has done another excellent job working hard in both the preceding off-season as well as during the season in both training and recruitment. Ben continues to lead the way with the Association training both face to face and via online. We look forward to the upcoming off-season and more courses on the Laws of Cricket, as well as professional development workshops that will be rolled out across the State, culminating in our next convention to be held at Port Macquarie in August. Ben also enjoyed another strong season on the National Umpire Panel, accrediting himself so well across Cricket Australia fixtures this year, also making his international debuts in October in the WT20 match between Australia and the West Indies at North Sydney Oval, followed by the WODI at Allan Border Field in the same week. We look forward to further opportunities for Ben whilst also managing his duties with our Association in his role as Education Officer.

I also wish to acknowledge the support and guidance provided to the Management team by Darren Goodger, who has also recently been promoted to Chief Premier Cricket and Country Cricket Officer at Cricket NSW. Darren dedicates significant time and energy to our Association and our members. His work as State Umpiring Manger and through his dedication to our match officials, New South Wales umpires continue to be proportionally over represented with Cricket Australia by having around half of all contracted umpires. As we celebrate the achievements of our umpires in 2023-24, many of our members continue to acknowledge and recognise Darren for his both his coaching and support in their preparation and on-field success that they continue to enjoy. We should also acknowledge Darren for the outstanding role model he is to those with whom he umpires in NSW Men's Premier Cricket, winning the Panel 1 Award for the 14th time and 9th consecutive season, an amazing achievement. My personal thanks again goes to Darren for the support he provides to me in my role as Chair of our Association.

I thank our Co-Patrons, Dick French OAM, Graham Reed OAM and Simon Taufel for their patronage, support, and interest in our Association during the season. Our congratulations extend to Graham on his Life Membership of the Sydney Cricket Association at their Annual General Meeting in August. Graham Chudleigh was also made a Life Member of the SCA that evening and both spoke well in the receiving of their awards.

I again acknowledge the support of Cricket NSW CEO, Lee Germon, for the faith he places in the Association to manage officiating affairs in New South Wales. We have a successful relationship with Cricket NSW, which is unlike other states and one we should not take for granted. Cricket NSW continues to be a wonderful supporter of our Association and their leadership is greatly appreciated.

From the Sydney Cricket Association, I wish to acknowledge Committee of Management Chair Graham Gorrie, NSW Premier Cricket Manager Roy Formica and Competitions Officer Sean Mantle for their ongoing support and our good working relationship. We are equally indebted to NSW Country Cricket Association and the work of Bruce Whitehouse for the opportunities afforded to country umpires. We acknowledged Roy at our annual dinner after announcement of his pending retirement and Bruce who will be changing roles at Cricket NSW, moving to risk and integrity. They have been excellent advocates for our association over many years and we wish them both well in their future endeavours.

Our Management team again successfully filled all appointments in Men's Premier and Shires fixtures for the Sydney Cricket Association. Whilst this has been the case for a number of years, the task remains challenging, with withdrawals often occurring at late notice. We should not take for granted the need to continue to grow our numbers to continue to fulfil this significant objective. Members also embraced the opportunity to officiate in the Cricket NSW Youth Championships again in 2023-24 with a substantial number of appointments made to members in these competitions.

New South Wales continues to be well represented with ten contracted umpires servicing professional cricket in Australia and internationally. Rod Tucker continues to perform at an outstanding standard as a member of the Elite Panel of ICC Umpires now having served 14 years at this level. Paul Wilson also performed to an excellent standard and was a respected member of the International Panel of ICC Umpires, prior to announcing his retirement from international umpiring at the ICC World Cup in India in November, having officiated in 13 men's and one women's Test match. Gerard Abood, Greg Davidson, Simon Lightbody and Ben Treloar remain on the Cricket Australia National Panel and again performed strongly, with Gerard winning the Cricket NSW Representative Umpire of the Year for the second year running. Our Supplementary Panel umpires in Sharad Patel, Troy Penman and Claire Polosak all received plenty of opportunities. It was most pleasing to see Claire make her first-class debut at the WACA Ground in the match between Western Australia and South Australia where Claire performed to a high standard in her first Sheffield Shield match.

Our New South Wales State Panel umpires again excelled, and it was pleasing to see Andrew Hamilton, Roberto Howard, Daniel Moran, Bede Sajowitz and Mitchell Claydon (in his first season on the State Panel) appointed to umpire at national championships and enhance their positions in the Cricket Australia umpiring pathway.

Toni Lorraine and Ian Wright are commended on their appointment to score the men's Test at the SCG between Australia and Pakistan and were joined on our international scorer panel by Darren Mattison who scored the Men's One-Day International between Australia and West Indies with Toni. Adrian Tham also received opportunities to score in the Women's ODI Internationals held at North Sydney Oval with Toni and Ian.

I also congratulate our Country Umpire Representative Panel umpires and highlight the appointment of Jeff Egan and Phil Rainger to the Men's Plan B Regional T20 Bash Final at Artie Smith Oval and Dave Cullen and Graeme Glazebrook to the Men's Country Championship Final played at Newcastle No.1 Sportsground. Lauren McGill and Elizabeth O'Dwyer were appointed to the Women's Country T20 Bash Final.

Three umpire exchange programs were arranged with the Western Australian Cricket Association, Cricket Victoria and Cricket Tasmania in 2023-24. We were able to host our Western Australian and Victorian colleagues, Dennis Smallwood and Ashfaq Ali in umpiring in Sydney, however logistical issues prevented us hosting an umpire from Tasmania this season. Reciprocating these exchanges, Patrick Jackson, Mitchell Claydon and Bede Sajowitz were afforded opportunities to umpire in Premier Cricket in Western Australia, Victoria and Tasmania respectively, an outstanding opportunity for our members in their ongoing development.

Celebrations and association spirit was evident for our Annual Dinner and Awards Night held at Bankstown Sports Club in April, with 198 members and guests in attendance. Alan Marshall (#14) and Arthur Watson (#15) were inducted into the NSWCUSA Hall of Fame (HoF). This was beautifully put together by the Association, appreciated by members of the late Alan Marshall's family and by Arthur Watson and his wife, Ann, who were in attendance. Arthur spoke superbly about his work with Alan over many years in honouring him. Alan and Arthur have been such outstanding ambassadors and contributors on and off the field. We owe so much to those who dug the well in the NSWCUSA, standing strongly on the shoulders of those who have gone before us. Alan and Arthur were deserving HoF inductees, they have done and achieved so much. Given their friendship, teamwork and respective contributions, it was fitting they were honoured on the same night.

We also recognised the exceptional international umpiring career of Paul Wilson who spoke passionately about his officiating journey having previously been an international cricketer. Paul endorsed our New South Wales umpiring system, being a great advocate for it to the Australian Cricket Council.

Jake Wholohan had an amazing night, being the recipient of the Alan Marshal Medal for rookie umpire of the year, presented by Alan Marshall's wife Ros, the Panel 2 Medal and the George Borwick Memorial Award, a trifecta that has only occurred once before in our Association's history. Neil Smith of Murray Border CUA (E. F. Wykes OAM Association Medal), Phil Rainger from Newcastle District CUA (Kevin Pye Medal), Jeff Evans from St.George DCC (Malcolm Gorham Scorers' Award) took out our other major awards. Other highlights included Darren Goodger winning the Panel 1 Medal for the 14th occasion and ninth consecutive season, with Daksh Trivedi and Andrew Searle taking the Panel 3 and 4 Medals.

We recognised scorers and umpires with representative certificates, along with all members who officiated in national finals in season 2023-24 with a medallion which included in attendance Gerard Abood, Mitchell Claydon, Nathan Harvey, Toni Lorraine, Lauren McGill, Troy Penman, Adrian Tham and Ian Wright. We should be proud of all these umpires and commend them for being such fine representatives of our Association.

Several members were acknowledged for their years of membership and service, including (20 years) Paul Dilley, Pat Kerin OAM and Balvinder Kumar; (25 years) Toni Lorraine and Ken Shaw; (30 years) Stephen Poole and Graham Watson; (35 years) Tom Iceton OAM. Other members brought up significant match milestones this season including Roberto Howard (200 matches), Tim Donahoo (400 matches) and Neil Smith (600 matches), each being presented with a certificate.

We recognised debuts for Janelle Carew (Scorer – BBL), Mitchell Claydon (Umpire – WBBL and WNCL) and Ben Treloar (Umpire – WODI and WT20I). Claire Polosak's first-class umpiring debut was also acknowledged, Claire being unable to attend due to her being en route to Karachi to umpire the women's international bilateral series between Pakistan and West Indies.

Whilst we celebrate the successes of those at the top end of the ladder, I again wish to thank the overwhelming majority of members who continue to display a dedication to serving both the game and our Association across all forms of cricket, especially across our country regions. We do not all get the opportunity to officiate at outstanding facilities and acknowledge the often-challenging conditions that may of our members umpire and score in across the State. To all of you who serve our Association, I again offer my thanks to you all for your dedication to the game and to your role as match officials.

Thanks to our sponsors and supporters, to McDonald's for their support of NSWCUSA and Cricket NSW and our clothing supplier Beastwear.

Finally, I wish to thank my fellow Directors for their contribution and service over the last year. Our Association continues to be in a strong financial position to meet future needs as we continue to grow. I thank all Directors for their passion they show for our Association and commitment to our umpires and scorers, and for their diligence to the cause over the last year. Whilst we can be pleased that NSWCUSA is well-placed, and we must continue to strive to be better, rather than being satisfied that with where we are at.

Association Awards

George Borwick Memorial Award

The George Borwick Memorial Award is named after our former Association President and Patron who umpired 24 Test matches, including in every Test of the Bodyline series. It was instituted in 1982 to perpetuate his memory.

George Borwick's dedication and commitment to umpiring and the Association was second-to-none in Australian umpiring. He enjoyed complete respect, was a loyal servant, a member for more than 55 years and is now a member of the Association's Hall of Fame.

The award is presented annually to the member who exemplifies the spirit of George Borwick's contribution by their efforts both on and off the field during the season. A points system is used to determine the winner taking into account: availability, meeting attendance and the average mark from captains' assessments.

The award was keenly contested, and in the end, there was just 0.15 of a mark between first and sixth.

The top six in the 2023-24 George Borwick Memorial Award were:

The winner of the George Borwick Memorial Award for season 2023-24 was Jake Wholohan.

Jake has displayed outstanding commitment by attending all Ordinary General Meetings, the Rules Night, and the Annual Convention. He was also available for all rounds in Men's Premier Cricket, officiating 16 preliminary round matches with captains praising his match management and communication, his ability to maintain concentration and positive attitude to the game. His match average from captains was an excellent 4.79 out of 5.

Jake has now umpired 19 SCA matches since joining the Association and made his First Grade debut in Round 16.

E. F. Wykes OAM Association Medal

The Ted Wykes Medal was struck in honour of our late President and Patron. Ted was also a long-serving Vice-President of New South Wales Cricket Association.

Ted was a Test Umpire and a person who was a great friend and mentor to many in our Association and so generous with the time he gave to improving the Association. A man of few words, Ted was a true leader by his actions and commitment. He was widely respected in the game as a man of the highest integrity.

The winner of the Ted Wykes Medal must be a member of an affiliated association who has displayed excellence and commitment to that association on and off the field throughout the season by way of meeting attendance, availability and consistent umpiring performance.

The winner of the E. F. Wykes OAM Association Medal for 2023-24 was Neil Smith.

Neil joined the Association in 2005 and has now umpired more than 600 matches. He is a member of the Murray Border Cricket Umpires' Association and performed to an excellent standard in his local competition. He came to Sydney to umpire a Men's First Grade fixture in which both captains assessed his performance as excellent in all categories, receiving a match average of 5 with one of the captains taking the time to provide a written comment about the high quality of his decision making, match management and communication skills.

Neil umpires Provincial First Grade in Cricket Albury Wodonga and is highly respected by local players, colleagues, coaches, and club administrators.

New South Wales Premier Cricket Panel Awards

The Panel Awards recognise excellence for the 'Umpire of the Year' in each grade as determined by captains' assessments throughout the season. To be eligible for a Panel Award a member must have officiated in at least 10 SCA matches.

Captains assess each umpire in terms of their decision making, decisiveness, match management and communication skills, concentration and level of positive attitude to the game. At the end of the season the umpire with the highest overall average wins the panel award.

Panel 1

The winner of the Panel 1 Award for season 2023-24 was Darren Goodger.

Darren had an extraordinary season with an incredible match average from First Grade captains of 4.98 out of 5. Captains praised him across the board for all aspects of his umpiring, but particular mention was made of his excellent decision making, match management and communication.

Having joined the Association in 1993, he was made a Life Member in 2009 and wins the Panel 1 Award for an unprecedented ninth successive season and has now won the award for the fourteenth time.

A life member of Clarence River District and Far North Coast Cricket Umpires' Associations, he has now officiated in 436 SCA matches, 319 of which have been in First Grade.

Panel 2

The winner of the Panel 2 Award for season 2023-24 was Jake Wholohan.

Jake joined the Association in September 2022 and had a fine debut season, with his consistent performances seeing him make his First Grade debut in Round 16.

He officiated 19 matches in season 2023-24 with captains praising his ability to maintain concentration, his positive attitude to the game and his decisiveness as he finished the season with an excellent Panel 2 match average of 4.76.

The winner of the Women's Panel 1 Award for season 2023-24 was Jim Harrod.

Jim joined the Association in 2016 and officiated 12 matches in season 2023-24. A dedicated member of both the NSWCUSA and the SWCUA he averaged 4.58 out of 5 with captains praising his attitude, match management and communication, along with his accurate decision making.

Country Umpire of the Year - Kevin Pye Medal

Obituaries - Troy Penman

Brian Ferguson (February OGM)

Brian joined NSWCUSA in October 1997. He served the Association on both the Examination Board and Social Committee. Brian also served a term as a Board Director.

Passionate about cricket and umpiring, Brian was always available to umpire and willing to share his vast experience and knowledge to benefit less experienced colleagues. So many members over the years can say they enjoyed a day umpiring with and learning from Brian Ferguson. He was a popular and respected figure in the Sydney Cricket Association for more than 25 years. Brian was also in more recent times a committed and respected member of the Sydney Shires CUA.

He made a significant contribution as an umpire standing in 409 SCA matches, 151 of which were in Men's Premier Cricket First Grade. Brian also umpired 34 matches in the Shires competition. He was a regular umpiring in the A.W. Green Shield competition over the years where he loved to witness and encourage young players as they progressed through the pathway to premier cricket.

Brian will live in the hearts of many he touched, remembered fondly and sadly missed.

Bob Guthrie (March OGM)

Bob joined the NSWCUSA in 1991 and upgrading to full membership in 2016.

Passionate about cricket and umpiring, Bob was always available to umpire and willing to share his vast experience and knowledge to benefit less experienced colleagues. Bob officiated in 302 Men's SCA matches, 226 of these matches being in Fourth and Fifth Grade working with newer umpires as a steady head to guide them on their umpiring journey.

He was a popular and respected umpire in the Sydney Cricket Association until season 2015-16 when he stepped away from umpiring on-field.

Bob had a deep connection to the Mosman Cricket Club with the Club providing the following on their social media channels when advising of Bob's passing:

"One of Mosman Cricket Club's great men sadly passed away during the week. Bob had been involved with MCC for nearly 50 years. Many of those spent on the sidelines watching his son Cameron play U9s and all the way through to First Grade.

Bob joined our Committee in the late 80s and would remain there for over 30 years. Always prepared to help wherever he could, Bob was heavily involved in the club's fight to save itself from relegation in the mid-90s.

A fight every player is now grateful for. Bob was also a decorated SCA umpire and spent many years driving around Sydney helping games of cricket run smoothly. In his later years, Bob spent every Saturday sitting on the hill at Allan Border Oval watching our current youngsters do their thing. Bob was a life member along with his son Cameron. The only father and son Life Members of our club."

Tony Hackett (December OGM)

Tony joined the Association in 2003 and during his 20 years of service to the Association made a significant contribution to the NSWCUSA as well as the Wagga Wagga Cricket Umpires' Association.

Secretary/Treasurer of the Wagga Wagga CUA for over 10 years, Tony and close friend Dennis Chaplin were the life blood of the affiliated association. In 2018 the Association's Annual Convention took place in Wagga Wagga with Tony, Dennis and others being wonderful hosts to the 162 members who attended.

On field Tony was an umpire of the highest order, the proud owner of cap number 35 from his time on the Country Umpire Representative Panel, Tony was known for his excellent communication skills and for ensuring matches were played in the right spirit.

Tony was bestowed with Principal membership of the Association in 2021, recognising his efforts across many years.

A sign of a person and their contribution to the game can be judged by how their passing is felt by others and Tony's passing has impacted many, he will be missed.

Chris Hardman (February OGM)

Chris originally joined our Association in 1992 and then rejoined in 2023. He resided in Goulburn being the Mathematics Coordinator at Trinity Catholic College. He was a respected match official in Southern Districts Cricket Zone. Chris was a highly regarded teacher of Mathematics, and an equally highly regarded Level 2 Cricket Coach. He taught for many years at St Pius College X Chatswood where he was the Master in Charge of Cricket and coach of the boys First XI cricket team. Chris passed away last month at the age of 64. He is survived by his mother Mary and his son Braden. He will be sorely missed by his family, his students and by his teaching and umpiring colleagues.

Brian Lalor (February OGM)

Brian joined the Association in 1985 being a member until the time of his passing in January. Brian was a servant to the game and held many roles throughout his time. As an umpire he stood in 370 Men's SCA matches between 1985 and 2013, 8 of these being in First Grade with another 133 in Second Grade.

Brian will be fondly remembered by Administration staff for always paying via cheque his and wife Joan's membership. Not so unique in the 90s, but by 2023 they were one of the only members paying via this method. Like clockwork each year the cheque would be received. Joan has been a member of the Association since 1997.

In what would have been a unique situation on a Premier Cricket ground, Brian officiated a match in which Joan was scoring and their son Kevin was playing.

Phil Leonard (December OGM)

Phil Leonard was a tireless worker for cricket and umpiring in the Macquarie Valley Cricket Council. A retired school-teacher and wonderful family man, Phil was a straight shooter, passionate about cricket and officiating the game he loved. He umpired across all grades in Dubbo, loved and respected by his colleagues, the players and wider cricket community.

A long serving member of Macquarie Valley Cricket Umpires' Association, Phil was an integral member of the executive and an outstanding dedicated Treasurer for many years. He joined the NSWCUSA in 1993. A selfless man with a wonderful dry sense of humour, Phil will be sorely missed. He passed away on November 27, aged 74.

We extend our deepest respect and sympathy to Phil's family, and also to our colleagues, and Phil's, in the MVCUA who are deeply affected by his passing at this time. We acknowledge with great respect Phil's incredible selfless extended contribution to umpiring and our game.

John McMahon OAM (February OGM)

John joined our Association in 1977 being a member until the time of his passing last month aged 91. He received the Medal of the Order of Australia for service to cricket. John played First Grade cricket for Balmain in Sydney and also played First Grade in Brisbane representing Queensland in two Sheffield Shield matches in season 1959-60. He was the Regional Director of Coaching for the Far North Coast Cricket Council for 18 years and served as a member of the New South Wales Country Cricket Association Committee of Management for more than a decade being the Deputy Chairman.

John received life membership of Lismore District Cricket Association, Far North Coast Cricket Council, North Coastal Cricket Zone, New South Wales Country Cricket Association and New South Wales Cricket Association. John was named in the Marist Brothers (Lismore) Cricket Club Team of the Century in 2017. John McMahon was an outstanding person and contributor to cricket. He is survived by wife Joan and his eight children, with three of his boys (Brian, Michael and Terry) all playing First Grade in Sydney.

Trevor Parker (October OGM)

It is with sadness that we advise of the passing of member Trevor Parker, Trevor passed away this morning aged 84. Trevor joined the Association in 1996 after a playing career with Burwood Briars which commenced in 1958. He started umpiring in the Sydney Women's competition and spent a number of seasons officiating in this competition prior to joining the Sydney Shires CUA in 2008. During his time in Men's SCA competitions Trevor officiated 173 matches.

Meetings - Bede Sajowitz


Nine General Meetings were held during the 2023-24 season, with the Annual General Meeting, a Special General Meeting and the seven regular Ordinary General Meetings.

ADMINISTRATION

Digital Media - Bede Sajowitz

Throughout 2023-24, the Association continued an active and extensive online presence, promoting training programs and showcasing the activities and achievements of members right across NSW.

NSWCUSA's digital content serves a number of purposes, with the significant focus being to promote and publicise the milestones and achievements of the members. Through the online channels, we also engage with potential members through advertising training courses and publish umpire appointments to Premier Cricket and Cricket Australia competitions.

Since the last Annual Report, Association content on Facebook has been viewed by close to 390,000 people, a substantial increase in exposure on last season - with many more engaged through other organisations and individuals sharing our content through their channels. The Association account now has 3,494 followers regularly engaged with the account with NSWCUSA content populating their feeds.

It's been an interesting year for X (formerly known as Twitter) with continued significant change to the platform creating a vastly different user experience. Content posted on the platform remained very similar, though viewership of NSWCUSA content fell to just over 6,000, despite an increase to 430 followers subscribed to the account.

The NSWCUSA website continues to serve members and the general public as a resource for providing information about the Association and umpiring both in New South Wales and in general. Over the course of the season, the website has served as a primary outlet for publishing news, appointments and details of upcoming training courses, both metropolitan and regional.

The website is also maintained with current contacts details for Management as well as detail on the Board and Association sponsors. There is also an archive of Annual Reports and In Black and White.

There is a members-only section of the website maintained for the benefit of members, available upon logging in. The more in-depth material includes the merchandise store, an extra method by which to obtain clothing and other items, such as membership renewal, with only a few clicks. Also featured in the members-only section is a Laws of Cricket quiz, set up for the benefit of members to attempt whenever they wish to challenge themselves and refresh their knowledge on the Laws.

These dedicated and knowledgeable volunteers, along with Ex-Officio Board Director Geoff Garland, were tireless in their efforts to further the Committee's aims around education of the membership. In addition, the Association's Education Officer, Ben Treloar, was a regular attendee at our meetings and provided invaluable assistance and advice.

It would be remiss of me not to record my gratitude for the service of retiring Committee member Sathish Kumar. His work on the Committee over a number of years is much appreciated.

This season, the Committee once again focused on three major areas: ongoing member education at Ordinary General Meetings, contributions to the Laws of Cricket questions for the education team's database, and assistance with the supervision and marking of exams conducted by the Association.

Ongoing Education

Laws of Cricket Questions

Throughout the season, members of the Committee prepared and reviewed Laws of Cricket questions for the pool maintained by the Education Officer, which is an ongoing exercise.

In addition to the questions for the Ordinary General Meetings, the Examination Committee also provided a set of questions on the Playing Conditions for the Finals Series of the NSW Men's Premier Cricket competition.

Exam Supervision and Marking

Throughout the season, the Association conducted training courses and exams both online and in-person. Committee members, under the leadership of the Education Officer, assisted with the conduct and supervision of the examinations associated with these training sessions. Several members of the Committee also contributed to the online training sessions conducted by the Education team.

Next Season

The Committee feels that the three themes have been successful and meaningful and has resolved to continue using them into next season.

We will continue to present at monthly OGMs on Laws of Cricket. Laws of Cricket questions will be an ongoing exercise during the off-season and season 2024-25, with the Committee working closely with the Association's staff to provide additional questions on the website. Similarly, exam supervision and marking will continue to be an ongoing activity undertaken by the Committee, both online and in-person.

Participation in the Examination Committee

The Examination Committee is an integral part of the ongoing education and training of both members and prospective members. The Board welcomes expressions of interest and nominations to join the Committee as part of the annual process of committee selections. Members are encouraged to make themselves available to serve on the Committee or to contribute to the Committee in other ways including submitting questions or scenarios related to the Laws of Cricket for inclusion in OGMs and/or online questions.

Female Umpire Engagement - Claire Polosak

Female umpires have been busy across the State this season, with an increase of 4% in number of active female umpires, and a 15% increase in appointments filled by women. While the increase of female umpires was modest compared to the number of appointments, this shows the tremendous number of opportunities that exist in the world of cricket in New South Wales.

This season saw the first summer where there appointments filled by female NSWCUSA members to matches organised by Cricket Australia. The Australian Country Cricket Championships were held in Newcastle in January, with five of the six female umpires appointed being NSWCUSA members.

The season also saw Lauren McGill appointed to the U16 Female National Championships where she finished the tournament with an appointment to the Final. Lauren was also appointed to the National Indigenous Cricket Carnival where she umpired the Women's Division Final as well. Elizabeth O'Dwyer was also appointed to the U19 Female National Championships where she received a semi-final appointment.

These additional appointments being available provide fantastic learning and development opportunities for our female umpires, and shows great support for their training and development.

The season started with a Female Umpire Training Day, which saw 18 umpires attend a day of training in the lead up to the new season. There were sessions on laws, goal setting, sports psychology, and LBWs. Thank you to Ben Treloar and Alan Mantle who facilitated sessions. A mid-season training session had a focus on communication, facilitated by Virginia Lette. The mid-season session was held in a hybrid manner, with 11 umpires attending.

The end of the season provides umpires the opportunity to reflect on their season and put into place actionable items and ideas in preparation for the 2024-25 season.

Other notable appointments this season include:

- Elizabeth O'Dwyer's First Grade debut in NSW Men's Premier Cricket in a match between Randwick Petersham and Blacktown Mounties.
- The U15 Female State Challenge was serviced by a solely female umpire panel. This panel was made up of Katie Collins, Sue Gregory, Kate Rowlands, and Manjinder Sandhu.

• Elizabeth O'Dwyer and Lauren McGill were appointed to the Women's Plan B Country Bash Final between Newcastle Blasters and Riverina Bullets at Cricket Central Oval.

During the year female members have also become a regular feature on the Association's volunteer Training team. Elizabeth O'Dwyer, through her involvement with the Examination Committee, presented at multiple OGMs during the year and presented a laws session at the Convention.

Sue Gregory and Elizabeth have also been involved in presentation the Association's Level 2 Laws of Cricket course and on professional development days, both in metropolitan and regional areas.

Thank you to all the umpiring associations around the State for their assistance in the development and training of female umpires. There are competitions all around the State that have females actively officiating and this is great for the game as a whole.

I am very much looking forward to the 2024-25 summer and what it will bring for all umpires around the State.

Observers - Bob Davis

During the 2023-24 season, seven off-field Observers (Laurie Borg, Graham Chudleigh, Errol Cranney, Bob Davis, John Evans, Rupert Mathews and Graham Reed) observed umpires officiating in NSW Premier Cricket matches. All are all former umpires.

In addition, three very experienced umpires (Geoff Garland, Darren Goodger, and Mark Hughes) provided valuable on-field observations for the umpires with whom they officiated.

During the past 12 years, a number of innovations have been introduced into umpiring in New South Wales, including many effective techniques that umpires now apply routinely on and off the field. Likewise, many new ways of working for the observer team have been developed by, or with the inspiration and encouragement of, our Executive Officers, including more detailed reporting, better scheduling, and involvement in panel and finals selections. The role of the Observer is now better understood by our members, and we are encouraged by the warm welcome we get from the umpires when we arrive at a ground.

Our Association believes that all officiating umpires are entitled to have a formal observation at least once during the season, to provide advice, guidance, and suggestions for improvement, so that all umpires have the opportunity to progress. Observers aim to ensure that early-career umpires have a solid grounding in basic umpiring techniques as quickly as possible, on which to build more advanced ones. We assist the more experienced umpires with the finer details of best practice, including the 'one-percenters' which can occur in unusual circumstances.

130 umpires from the Men's Premier Cricket Panel were observed at least once, with most of the others not officiating in the final few rounds. We will make a point of observing them as early as possible next season.

Our Association welcomed 42 members from regional New South Wales, Shires, and elsewhere to officiate in NSW Premier Cricket matches, and we observed 30 of them. The high standard of umpiring from these members was noted, and we hope to see them again in future seasons.

In summary, your observing team made 387 observations of 164 umpires during the season, up from 371 observations of 158 umpires last season.

Observers usually discuss what they have seen with the umpires during match day, to provide immediate feedback, suggestions, advice, and encouragement to the umpire, and to provide an opportunity for them to ask questions. A formal report is later prepared and sent, via our Association's Education Officer, to each umpire for reference. Many umpires reply, thanking the observer for the reports, and we appreciate your kind responses.

Observers will usually speak informally with one or both captains during a match, to get their thoughts on the umpires' performance. Most captains understand the role of the Observer and provide thoughtful and constructive comments for the development of umpires. Captains continue to comment favourably on the year-on-year improvement in the standard of umpiring, a tribute to our Association's Education and Development team, and to the dedication of our umpires themselves.

PAGE 92 | EDUCATION AND DEVELOPMENT

We are delighted to continue to report the high levels of preparation, teamwork and communication amongst umpires. These characteristics are essential at the higher grades, and umpires at all levels have demonstrated strong evidence of improving these skills. These areas require continuous and consistent effort for success.

Umpires are encouraged to prepare a brief list of match goals, actions which the umpire intends to focus on during the match. This proves exceptionally useful, significantly aids match preparation, and is strongly recommended to all umpires. Observers monitor match goals and provide feedback to the umpires on their success in achieving them.

We are grateful to the State Umpire Manager, Darren Goodger, and the administration team (Troy, Bede, Claire, Ben, and Roberto), for their support, advice, and encouragement throughout the season.

We all enjoy what we do, and the feedback we have received from those about whom we have reported has been very encouraging.

We thank all the umpires in NSW Premier Cricket for the spirit in which our activities have been received. We are grateful for your understanding of our role and appreciate your support throughout the season. Like umpires, our aim is to improve the service we provide: if you have any suggestions to help us do so, please advise any of us, or the State Umpire Manager.

At the end of the 2022-23 season, Cricket ACT terminated its Memorandum of Understanding with Country Cricket NSW. As a result, ACT ceased to be part of the ACT-Southern Districts Zone, leaving Southern Districts to stand alone as a Zone from season 2023-24. The boundaries for the new Zone were then redrawn with the Highlands District Cricket Association leaving the Greater Illawarra Zone to join Southern Districts.

As usual, all intending umpires completed an open book examination on the Laws of Cricket and a pre-season field craft session was also conducted for all members. During each monthly meeting, the Training Committee led discussions about Laws of Cricket and Playing Conditions scenarios and various aspects of field craft.

Season Highlights:

Two Cricket Championships were conducted in Wollongong during the season, the Women's National Veterans Cricket Championship and the Aussie Cricket League Under 19 Championship. The following umpires officiated in these Championships:

Well, 2023-24 was an action-packed season in the Zone. So many made significant contributions to this great game, on and off the field. I will endeavour to portray the Zone's activities in my Annual Report. Enjoy!

There were challenges with availability, but despite this throughout the season, a number of umpires displayed a commitment and dedication to the game. The umpires play a significant role in the game and again this season did a solid job, which was appreciated by managers and players.

Washouts, as with any cricket season, played a part on game day and it did not discriminate, whether during the week or over the weekends, meaning the Duckworth-Lewis-Stern system was accessed regularly. Over the course of the season 136 appointments were washed out in the NDCA competitions.

Often forgot, ground staff did an outstanding job throughout the season, with a demanding number of matches played within the Zone. I know they take pride in the work they do, and everyone puts in and prepares a game day pitch, despite the challenges to the best of their abilities - a tremendous effort!

Umpires within the Zone also supported neighbouring districts in the Central Coast and Upper/Lower Hunter in matches from junior through to veterans, male and female.

It was terrific to also welcome and host the Toyota Australian Country Cricket Championships in January. Local officials were involved during these championships.

The NDCA Women's T20 competition continued with 14 teams now being played in two divisions – Cup and Plate. In addition, there was a Development League held later in the season involving nine teams. The NDCA Suburban Districts competition grew further, to 65 teams over seven divisions.

The season 2023-24 commenced locally with professional development days conducted in conjunction with AGMs for the Far North and Mid North Coast Cricket Umpires' Associations at Lismore and Port Macquarie. Each weekend also included an introduction of OfficialsHQ with members from across each of the affiliates benefitting. We thank Ben Treloar, Darren Goodger, Clarie Polosak, and Bede Sajowitz for attending the north coast and in providing sessions via Teams.

As indicated, the introduction of OfficialsHQ and the CNSW Strategic Partnerships entered into by each Council and local associations within the Zone, required further discussion and guidance to umpires. In particular, the impact of the partnership with respect to the CNSW By-Laws and Code of Conduct process was covered at each course and ongoing training was provided at meetings throughout the season.

Highlights this season included for the first time in a number of seasons, all competitions playing grand finals. Members were also well represented across local senior and junior competitions and at the representative level.

I congratulate Far North Coast umpires Peter Kent, Kate Rowlands, Owen Turner and Ricky Welsh who were appointed to NSW Men's Premier Cricket matches. Kate's season also included appointments to Youth Championships, Country Female Championships, and Australian Country Championships in Newcastle. This will take some time to get off the ground but hopefully when in place we will see cricket prosper and grow even more.

Finally, I would like to thank the staff at NSWCUSA for their advice and support in running the training aspect and a special mention to Claire Polosak and Ben Treloar for their commitment in servicing what is a large area with long travel times. I should also thank Neil Findlay for his assistance and willingness to help out when asked.

NSW Cricket Association - Mark Hughes

NSWCUSA is one of a number of associations that provides a delegate to meetings of the NSWCA, this was my eighth season as NSWCUSA's representative to these meetings.

The 166th Annual General Meeting of the NSWCA was held in-person this year at Cricket Central on 4 September 2023. The reappointment of NSWCA patron The Honorable Margaret Beazley AO QC was approved, along with vice patrons The Hon. John Howard OM AC and Basil Sellers AM. Belinda Haggett and Peter Toohey were nominated by the Board to be elected as Life Members at the Annual General Meeting (AGM).

No election was held for the positions of three Directors to the Cricket NSW Board at the AGM. Ed Cowan, Richard Timbs and Courtney Smith filled the positions vacated from the expiring Board positions. Stuart Clark also filled a position of Elected Director, following the resignation of Neil Maxwell from the Board. David Gallop and John Knox were Appointed Directors to the Board.

Annual financial statements were tabled showing NSWCA to continue to be in a strong financial position. The budget for 2023-24 was presented with a breakeven budget forecast for the year ahead, with a continued increase in ongoing expenditure for Cricket Central.

During the year, performances from senior NSW representative teams did not achieve results desired, with no senior titles won in 2023-24. The NSW Blues finished the season in third place in the Sheffield Shield, a marked improvement on the previous season. The Blues were runners up in the One-Day Cup, finishing the season in first place with the hosting rights to the final held at Cricket Central Oval, losing to Western Australia. The NSW Breakers finished 5th in the WNCL. In the BBL the Sydney Sixers finished 2nd after the regular season, with the Sydney Thunder finish 8th on the ladder. The Sixers won the Qualifier against the Heat to host the BBL Final at the SCG, however the result was reversed when Brisbane won the Final by 54 runs. In the WBBL, the Sydney Thunder finished a point ahead of the Sixers to take the final place in the finals series, going down in the Eliminator to the Heat.

Delegates meetings during the year were held at Cricket Central. Delegates were provided regular updates at Ordinary General Meetings (OGMs) from Chief Executive Officer Lee Germon. At each meeting, Mr Germon reminded delegates of the importance of our values, how we play the game, vision, for cricket to be New South Wales' most loved and successful sport and for Cricket NSW to be regarded as a world class organisation, and purpose, to inspire everyone to love cricket.

Mr Germon continued to reiterate Cricket NSW's wildly important goal, to double the number of persons aged between 5-12 playing/watching/loving cricket by 2025, noting that those that play for three seasons or more contribute 70% to revenue. Cricket NSW is experiencing strong growth in the 5–12-year-olds age group participating in cricket again this year, with 56,000 involved, a 33% increase in participation. Blast numbers in particular are very strong, with a 65% increase season on season, with the number of girls in the game up 62%.

Delegates were provided regular updates in meetings on high-performance and participation programs along with progress updates on Cricket NSW's wildly important goal. Much time in the OGMs was spent in open forum discussions surrounding cricket performance. Delegates were also provided with presentations during the year from Governance & Integrity, Premier & Country Cricket along with Cricket Performance.

Updates were also provided from the Chairman on Cricket Australia matters, of note Australia's success in winning the ICC Men's World Cup in India, with half of the squad from New South Wales. Future funding from Cricket Australia is likely to be flat, with the latest TV rights deal not bringing in the revenue anticipated, which will have a flow down effect to the State and Territory associations. There is also significant focus on ensuring New South Wales retains the right for the timing of the New Year's Test at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

Delegates were reminded of the excellent work of our umpiring staff at Cricket NSW and continue to be acknowledged for providing 100% coverage of Men's Premier Cricket and Sydney Shires. It was again noted that umpiring development and progression in New South Wales is regarded as the best in Australia. This is a wonderful achievement and an excellent reflection on the work from our hardworking team on staff at Cricket NSW.

As in previous years, the criteria for umpires for panel selection included availability, commitment, perceived match fitness and suitability, previous observations, reports from captains and attendance at necessary meetings. The Committee made selections based on ability already displayed with some room also left for intuition in selections. The Committee ensured that selections on the various panels were made on merit.

The off-field observers were Laurie Borg, Graham Chudleigh, Errol Cranney, Bob Davis, John Evans, Rupert Mathews, and Graham Reed, all of whom worked tirelessly to observe 164 different umpires and in total made 387 observations. A total of 185 umpires officiated in Men's Premier Cricket in season 2023-24.

Treasurer's Report - Laurie Borg

The Treasurer's Report contains the Statement of Income and Expenditure together with the Statement of Assets and Liabilities for NSWCUSA in its 111th year ending 30 April 2024.

Statement of Income and Expenditure

The Association's overall result was a surplus of \$17,485.45.

Income totalled \$151,419.92, with the main components comprising:

- Umpire Service and Accreditation Grants \$75,960.44.
- Merchandise sales accounted for \$31,752.65, with a loss of \$43,548.52 occurring for two reasons:
 - The continued low-price reduction sale of Centenary merchandise.
 - McDonald's sponsorship of the Association allowed members to be sold field shirts at a subsidised cost. Please note that the above loss would be reduced by the sponsorship of \$30,000 for 2022-24. This means that the real loss was only \$13,548.52, approximately the same value of the commemorative polo shirts given out to all members as a gift.
- Member and affiliate subscriptions were again the backbone of our income, totalling \$62,614.95.

Expenditure totalled \$133,934.47, presenting a 22.98% decrease on 2022-23:

Administration Expenses

The total cost of the 2022-23 Annual Report was \$2,880, a 4% increase, however the great work done by Troy & Bede in preparation and formatting is value for money.

Honoraria payments worth \$14,330 recognised the continued wonderful contribution of our hard-working volunteers.

General expenses of \$2,308.26 is a decrease from 2022-23 due to an \$18,000 deposit paid on the membership gifts during 2022-23.

Funds previously paid to Cricket NSW for the rental of workstations has been removed by Cricket NSW with our thanks.

Training Expenses

The Board is committed to subsidising the cost of education and development programs for members.

The continued concentration on the training and development of umpires and scorers saw spending of \$74,338.64, a 3.14% decrease, owing to the locations visited for the face-to-face training programs. Visits to regional areas lead by Ben Treloar was able to deliver program to prospective umpires. A great Convention was delivered by the Training team at Penrith Panthers and Cricket Central, returning a loss of \$30,884.80.

Hospitality

The Annual Dinner and Awards Night was again held at Bankstown Sports Club at a net cost of \$10,369.42.

The work by the Administration team was again outstanding for the enjoyment of our members.

Statement of Assets and Liabilities

Total cash and deposits, as of 30 April 2024, amounted to \$269,285.48.
